RE: Essential travel as a TAFE student

The bearer of this letter is a student at Kangan Institute who is currently permitted to attend campus for education.

This permission is in line with the Victorian Government Recovery Roadmap's move into the Second Step announced in September, which permitted VCAL, VCE and final-year apprentices on campus for training from 12 October.

The advice from the Department of Education and Training is that:

Students do not need a permit to study on campus, even if it is across the metropolitan Melbourne/regional boundary. However, students who need to cross the boundary (i.e. where they cannot learn from home) should carry their student identification, and a letter or similar to state their enrolment, the purpose of travel, their usual hours (if applicable) and contact details of a relevant faculty member.

When on campus students are required to wear masks and follow physical distancing guidelines in line with requirements of the Victorian Chief Health Officer. The move to the Third Step as of October 28 has not altered this position.

Kangan Institute continues to follow guidelines issued by the Victorian Government and the Department of Education and Training in the ongoing response to coronavirus (COVID-19).
